Call for Presentations

Submission Deadline: April 10, 2023

You are invited to submit a presentation or poster proposal for the 2023 CGI Integrated Care Conference taking place October 9-11, 2023 at the Gila River Resorts – Wild Horse Pass & Conference Center in Chandler, Arizona. Due to the professional diversity of integrated care professionals, we welcome presentations with scientific data, clinical innovations, community designed projects, policy and governance partnerships, and entrepreneurial proposals.

The 2023 CGI Integrated Care Conference is an opportunity to meet, reconnect, learn together, and share ideas with others involved in the field of Integrated Care. The purpose of the conference is to bring together and inform medical and mental health providers, public health professionals, community health workers, caregivers, policy-makers, researchers, and educators who want to improve their understanding of integrating care and improve their ability to serve vulnerable populations. Didactic and experiential proposals for breakouts will be accepted, and poster submissions from students and emerging researchers are welcomed. A welcome reception will take place on October 9, 2023. This is a great opportunity for you to meet new integrated care allies!

The theme of the 2023 CGI Integrated Care Conference is *Opportunity in Crisis - Using Adverse Pandemic Experiences to Drive Healthcare Improvement*.

Deadline for submissions: April 10, 2023

Submission Topics

The Proposal Review Committee is especially interested in proposals on the topics of:

- **Population health solutions** - integrated care for vulnerable populations, addressing health determinants and reducing health inequities
- **Cultural values** - care for providers, trauma informed care environments, community and patient education/awareness/participation
- **Community collaboration & outreach** - co-designed and community-led healthcare improvement efforts, community partnerships, care pathways involving caregivers, care coordination with patients as partners, and shared decision making
- **Policy & legislation** - Policy work aimed at improving health outcomes and care delivery
- **Emerging research in integrated care** - new horizons, student work, looking to the future of healthcare delivery
- **Workforce capacity** - educational determinants of health, training and education, retention
- **Integrated systems of care** - system-wide leadership & governance
- **Business of integrated care delivery** - quality Improvement, return on investment analyses, medical loss ratio analyses, integrated payment systems and financial incentives enabling integration
- **Digital solutions** - EHR integration, risk stratification, telehealth solutions

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Submission Categories

Breakout Sessions:

- Breakout Sessions can be panel sessions, workshops, seminars, or didactic presentations.
- Breakout Session Submissions are open to students, faculty, graduates, and any professional working in the integrated care space.
- These sessions may have one speaker or multiple speakers.
- Breakout Sessions will be 50 minutes in duration with 10 minutes at the end for Q&A.
- Each individual speaker is required to submit their bio, headshot, and CV.

Poster Presentations:

- Poster Presentation submissions are open to students, faculty, and graduates of doctoral programs focused in integrated care.
 - For students enrolled in DBH programs or other doctoral programs focused on integrated care, the poster submission must reflect individual work
 - For faculty and graduates, poster submissions may reflect the work of partners or individual work/research.
- Posters should be ready to display on October 10, 2023 by 8:00 a.m., and may be displayed until the end of the event on October 11, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. All posters accepted will be displayed for the entirety of the two full conference days on October 10-11, 2023.
- The Review Committee will judge the top 5 posters according to a rubric, and those posters will be selected for a poster presentation session at the conference. Poster presenters will be notified after the review committee has reviewed all posters and made its final decision on the top 5 to be presented.
- The Poster Presentation Session for the top 5 posters selected will allow a 10 minute presentation for each of the 5 presenters. Should a selected poster have more than one author, the authors must select a presenter who will be available to present live for 10 minutes during the session.
- Each individual author is required to submit their bio, headshot, and CV.
 - If you are submitting a poster submission with more than one author, each individual author will need to submit their bio, headshot, and CV as a participant in your submission.
 - You will not be able to fully submit your proposal until every participant has completed their portion.

How to submit a presentation proposal:

Complete and submit the corresponding presentation interest form per proposal by the deadline of **April 10, 2023**. There is a separate form for each submission category.
